<p>We teach MFL to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Develop an interest in and thirst for learning other languages.• To introduce the learning of the Spanish language and the understanding of its culture in enjoyable and stimulating ways.• Embed the essential skills of speaking, listening, reading and writing.• Lay the foundations for future language learning.• Foster children's curiosity and deepen their understanding of the world.• Enable children to express their ideas and thoughts in another language and to understand and respond in both speech and writing.• Provide the foundation for learning other languages.	<p>When teaching MFL we:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• To listen attentively to spoken language and show understanding by joining in and responding.• To explore the patterns and sounds of language through songs and rhymes.• To engage in conversations: ask and answer questions; express opinions and to respond to those of others; seek clarification and help when required.• To speak in sentences, using familiar vocabulary, phrases and basic language structures.• To develop accurate pronunciation and intonation.• To present ideas and information orally to a range of audiences.• To read carefully and show understanding of words, phrases and simple writing.• To broaden their vocabulary and develop their ability to understand new words.• To appreciate stories, songs, poems and rhymes in the language.• To write phrases from memory and adapt these to create new sentences, to express clear ideas.• To describe people, places, things and actions orally and in writing.• To understand basic grammar appropriate to the language being studied eg: masculine, feminine and neuter forms and the conjugation of high frequency verbs; key features and patterns of	<p>In learning MFL pupils will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• To be aware that a language has a structure and that the structure differs from one language to another.• To have developed their language and communication skills in speaking, listening, reading and writing.• To have enriched their language learning by developing an understanding of the Spanish culture.• To be well prepared to effectively and successfully continue and develop their language skills through further learning.• To speak with increasing confidence and fluency and continually improve the accuracy of their pronunciation and intonation.• To find ways of communicating what they want to say e.g; through discussion and by asking questions.
