The Kapow scheme offers opportunities to monitor progress through formative and summative assessment.

Impact

There is guidance for teachers to support assessment of children against the learning objectives and at the end of each unit, there is a performance element where teachers can make a summative assessment of children's learning.

Knowledge organisers for each unit, support children by providing a highly visual record of the key learning from the unit, encouraging recall of practical skills, key knowledge and vocabulary.

Children will be:

- Confident performers, composers and listeners and be able to express themselves musically at and beyond school.
- Able to show an appreciation and respect for a wide range of musical styles from around the world and will understand how music is influenced by the wider cultural, social and historical context in which it is developed.

Children in Year 1 to Year 6 will also experience one term of instrumental lessons, through a whole class project, provided by Rochdale Music service. The range of instruments available are, for example-Brass, Percussion, Ukulele.

Children will also be given the opportunity to perform a concert for parents, at the end of their class project.

Children are given opportunities to sing and play untuned percussion, as part of assemblies, whole school celebrations and as part of Nativity performances. Furthermore- Kapow gives excellent support materials and videos for less confident teachers, to support curriculum delivery.

- Demonstrate and articulate an enthusiasm for music and be able to identify their own musical preferences.
- Meet the end of key stage expectations outlined in the National Curriculum for Music.
