Emperors and Empires



Welcome back!

We can't wait to get started with our new term and our new topic '*Emperors and Empires*'. You will need your **PE kit** every Wednesday, so please come dressed in this. This includes: black shorts/joggers/leggings, white t-shirt and pumps and trainers. Thank you.

English: The Goose Guard by Terry Deary

- We will be writing setting descriptions, biographies, letters, myths, poetry and non-chronological reports this term
- One of our main focuses will be on composing sentences using different punctuation and also focusing on correct spellings.



Computing: Networks

Children will learn how information moves around a network, they will demonstrate how a website works, identify the role of packet data and finally they will explore the role of routers and be able to recognise links between networks and the internet.

RE:

We will be focusing on Christianity this term. Looking at the creation story, how to care for others, the story of Adam and Eve as well as ceremonies, vows and Jesus impact on the world.

PE:

In PE we will be focusing on throwing and catching skills as well as core strength. The children will learn what their heart rate is and why it changes during exercise as well as learning about their breathing rate

PSHE:

We will learn about 'Me and my relationships' and 'Valuing differences' looking at who are special people are, how we can look after them, resolving problems, rules, respect and our community.

Science : Animals and Humans and scientific enquiry.


We will learn about the five key food groups, nutrition and how to identify that humans and some other animals have skeletons and muscles for support, protection and movement. We will also be conducting experiments focusing on: how to improve a solar oven, what solution cleans coins the best and fair testing when making cakes. The children will learn how to ask relevant questions and use different types of scientific enquiries to answer them, set up simple practical enquiries, comparative and fair tests and record findings and draw simple conclusions.

• Maths: Place Value, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division

- We will be learning about representing numbers to 1000, partition numbers to 1000 and estimating on a number line. We will also learn how to add and subtract 2 and 3 digit numbers across a 100 and finally the children will learn their 3's, 4's and 8 times tables and divisions.

• Topic: Emperors and Empires

We will learn about Rome in topic this term, the children will learn about everyday life in Ancient Rome, the Roman emperors, what it was like to rule in Rome. We will also learn about the Roman army, the first invasion of Britain, Boudicca's rebellion and Hadrian's wall. Finally we will learn about Roman invention and Roman roads / towns as well as religion and Romanisation in the local area.
